Incumbents In Parishwide Races Face Challengers

BATON ROUGE — Qualifying ended Aug. 8 for the Oct. 12 election. In parishwide races, Sheriff Sid Gautreaux, a Republican, is favored over his two Democratic opponents, Carlos Jean and Mark Milligan. Assessor Brian Wilson, a Republican, has drawn a challenge from Democrat Jonathan Holloway, Sr., Clerk of Court Doug Welborn, a Republican and former Metro Councilman from Central, is opposed by Democrat Metro Council member Donna Collins-Lewis.

QUALIFYING — Sheriff Sid Gautreaux qualified for reelection Oct. 12. He was joined by his wife Susan, Clerk of Court Doug Welborn, and Allied Buckley of the East Baton Rouge Parish Sheriff's office.

Perhaps the most highly-contested parishwide race is expected to be for Coroner between incumbent Republican Dr. Beau Clark and Democrat Dr. Rati Whitfield. At the close of qualifying, two Central area legislators were reelected without opposition. Reps. Valerie Hodges (R-Watson) and Harry Ivey (R-Central) will have new four-year terms. Sen. Boh White (R-Central) drew opposition from attorney Rufus Hayes, who is running as a Libertarian.
